e can't remember when Mauli wasn't a teaching artist doing dance residencies in schools, conducting arts education professional development sessions, and just being around as one of our arts education sounding boards. Mauli has a Masters in Fine Arts in Dance and has been on the faculty of Kaua'i Pacific Elementary School and Kanuikapono Hawaiian Charter School. She is also a Teaching Artist for the Kennedy Center's National Tour.

As with all of HSFCA's roster of teaching artists, there is even more. For Mauli, work and play is a way of life. "So often my work seems more like play and my idea of play seems to be training for my work. Loving my work and colleagues is a great blessing on my life. Many people would consider it drudgery to have to go to workshops on the weekend. For me arts education workshops, whenever they are held, are delightful social events that have the added feature of giving me more tools to work with."

When she is at her home on Kaua'i, she finds many ways to enjoy her weekends. "Picture a beautiful beach with crystal clear ocean water, easy parking, no crowds, just a few nice folks, birds, maybe a monk seal resting in the sand. That would be my life on Kaua'i. A real luxurious weekend day would include not only the swimming but a walk in any one of the stunning areas that surround us here on the Garden Island, a yoga class, and dinner and evening fun with friends."

Then there's the hula. "My hula family is very dear to me and over the years has developed into a very extended 'ohana spanning several islands.

My kumu hula Vicky Holt Takamine is based on Oʻahu so I try to get visits to her and the O`ahu halau whenever I can. We have a Kauaʻi branch of the halau which I lead and cherish."

In 1993, the late Aunty Winona Beamer, with Mauli as her apprentice, received a HSFCA Folk & Traditional Arts Apprenticeship Grant for the pair to work together in hula ki'i. This close relationship also led to working with Aunty Nona to publish books on hula, and to an enriching relationship with many members of the Beamer family.

Mauli says, "I think I have lasted so long in teaching in large part because of my great love of kids. My goal in teaching or performing dance and storytelling for elementary students is to incite in them a lifelong love of learning, an excitement about trying new things, a firm belief in their own potential to be a success at whatever they try, a deep respect for humanity and a delight in daring to explore their creativity."


First Friday at the Hawai'i State Art Museum Friday, December 7, 2012, 6 – 9 p.m., Hawai'i State Art Museum, Free


SEEKING BIENNIUM GRANTS PANELISTS

Upcoming Arts Workshop for Classroom Teachers

The course is offered by Honolulu Theatre for Youth with partial funding from the Hawai'i State Foundation on Culture and the Arts through the National Endowment for the Arts and appropriations by the State Legislature. Professional development for teachers is one of HSFCA Arts Education Program's major initiatives.

Title: Before Pencil Touches Paper: Creativity-based Strategies to Get K-6 Struggling Students Ready to Write Dates: Saturdays, January 26, February 23, and March 30, 2013 Time: 9am - 4pm Cost: \$150 Location: Office of Curriculum Instruction and Student Services, 22nd Ave, Honolulu, HI. Instructors: Paul Wood and Daniel A. Kelin, II

Teachers will learn creative approaches to engage students in developing ideas into stories in advance of putting pencil to paper. Teachers will understand how to guide students to play with words and images, to trust imaginative impulses and to visualize character experiences in order to verbally and collaboratively shape ideas into individualized stories. Teachers will develop skills in engaging students kinesthetically, emotionally, and intellectually, encouraging them to personally invest in story-making to increase their understanding of story structure and creative expression. The processes demonstrated in this course are especially geared toward students who struggle with basic writing skills which impede their ability to express themselves.
