## ***April is Tsunami Awareness Month***

April is traditionally designated as Tsunami Awareness Month in Hawaii to honor the victims of the April 1, 1946 Aleutian Islands Tsunami. The April 1st Tsunami was the deadliest natural disaster in Hawaii's recent history, claiming 159 lives. It was also the impetus for the statewide warning system. Federal, State, and Local stakeholders annually sponsor a number of awareness events to educate the public on the dangers of tsunami. Visit Honolulu Hale during the month of April to view special informational banners that gives an idea of how large and dangerous tsunamis can be.
